



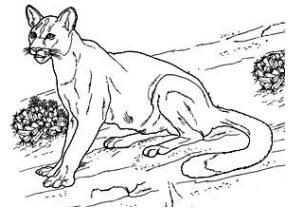

Do You Know?

The Simi Hills Wildlife Corridor Can Be Maintained with a Protective Cleanup of the Former SSFL Site

- **Mountain lions, bobcats, deer and other mammals travel between the Santa Susana and Santa Monica Mountains via the Simi Hills.** They are struggling to survive in a developed and fractured landscape that prevents them from moving easily and safely.
- **The Santa Susana Field Laboratory, located in a narrow section of the Simi Hills wildlife corridor, has been designated as a future open space and parkland.**
- Fifty years of research and testing at the SSFL site caused contamination by chemical and radioactive materials. **The site must be cleaned to a protective health standard.**
- **Politicians are requiring a cleanup of the SSFL site that will strip millions of cubic yards of soil and habitat from the current Simi Hills wildlife corridor and future parkland.** This cleanup plan has never before been required at any other site in the U.S.
- **The SSFL CAG believes the cleanup must be sensible and not strip the site of the natural, historical and archaeological resources which make it worthy for future parkland designation.**
- **Join with SSFL CAG in support of a sensible plan to protect wildlife and the Simi Valley Wildlife Corridor by cleaning the SSFL site to the EPA suburban residential standard.** This EPA standard is used throughout the U.S. to protect people at cleaned sites and is protective of wildlife too.



We Need a Cleanup the Simi Hills Wildlife Corridor Can Live With!

Cleaning the Former SSFL to EPA's Suburban Residential Standard Would:

- **Dramatically reduce the amount of habitat destruction while protecting wildlife and visitors.**
- **Protect and permanently expand existing wildlife habitat.**
- **Protect the SSFL site from new roads and widening of existing roads.**
- **Protect the site as open space, a park and recreational site.**
